Introduction

This lesson allows the students to think about those in their communities who volunteer their time to ensure that the community is safe and presentable. The students should gain a greater appreciation for their community helpers as well as consider ways in which they can serve.

Learning Objectives

<u>CCSS.ELA-Literacy.RI.4.10</u>. By the end of year, read and comprehend informational texts, including history/social studies, science, and technical texts, in the grades 4-5 text complexity band proficiently, with scaffolding as needed at the high end of the range.

Materials Needed

· Community Helpers reading passage

Procedure

- 1. Create a class bubble map and guide the students through defining community helper.
- 2. Read the short reading passage "Community Helpers". As the students are reading, have them annotate in the margins of the text concerning the helpers who are discussed.
- 3. Discuss the passage as a class.
- 4. Have the students independently brainstorm how they can serve as a community helper.
- 5. The students should select one idea from their brainstorm list and research how they can implement their service into action.
- 6. The students should then take that one idea and create a flow chart outlining the steps to becoming a community helper.
- 7. Allow the students an opportunity to present their charts so that the class will become familiar with the various ways that their classmates would like to serve.
