Introduction

In this lesson, students will read about and then compare two known African-American heroes: Maya Angelou and Martin Luther King Jr.

Learning Objectives

Materials Needed

- · Martin Luther King Jr. Facts
- · Maya Angelou Facts
- · Venn diagram
- · Paper and pencil

Procedure

Activity One: African American Heroes

- 1. Ask students, "What character traits are important for being considered a hero?"
- 2. Next, tell students that today they will learn about two important African-American historical heroes: Maya Angelou and Martin Luther King Jr.
- 3. Tell students that oftentimes heroes share a lot of the same characteristics and today they will be reading about and then comparing and contrasting those two key heroes.
- 4. Next, as a class read about Maya Angelou and MLK Jr. As you read, stop along the way to point out key similarities and differences between the two heroes.
- 5. Once you've finished reading about the heroes, fill out the Venn diagram together as a class.
